## Impact of Medicare's Proposed Home Health Cuts

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has proposed a **permanent -9.36% payment rate cut** to Medicare home health beginning in 2024. In total, cuts to home health could reach **\$20 billion** over the next ten years.

Home healthcare is already experiencing a 3.9% cut that began in 2023. New cuts will only worsen troubling trends that are already making it harder for Medicare patients to leave the hospital and go home with care that helps them recover and rehabilitate.

It doesn't have to be this way. The Medicare home healthcare program offers healthcare that is specifically designed to meet the needs of someone requiring clinically advanced services. Without proper funding, it cannot provide clinically advanced, patient preferred care in the home to everyone who needs it.
